



## QUARTERLY UPDATE (JULY TO SEPTEMBER 2024)

### Introduction

This report provides updates on the progress of GEC’s activities for the third quarter (Q3) of 2024: July to September.

### River Care Programme

#### **Webinar series with Yayasan PETRONAS**

In Q3 2024, GEC and Yayasan PETRONAS kick-started its series of webinars and panel discussions on natural disasters in Malaysia under the Enhancing Local Action and Community Participation in Disaster Preparedness & Response Project. Two webinars were organised, one on July 10, entitled “*Bencana Alam di Malaysia: Tahukah Anda?*” where 221 participants learnt on the mechanism for disaster management from National Disaster Management Agency (NADMA). The other one on “*Senario Banjir di Malaysia*”, was held on Sept 10 with 187 participants, featuring speakers from Department of Irrigation Drainage (DID) Malaysia, National Water Research Institute of Malaysia (NAHRIM), and NADMA.



#### **Exciting events Kampung Sg Tonggang**

On July 20, 22 OA community members from Kampung Kenang and 10 from Kampung Sg Tonggang participated in a Community Empowerment and Capacity Building Programme in Ecotourism Management. The programme is part of the activities under the Hasanah Special Grant 2023, supported by Yayasan Hasanah and the Ministry of Finance Malaysia.



#### **Cyberjaya Lake Gardens’ wetland planting**

Under the Community-based Ecological Restoration at Cyberjaya Lake Garden project, GEC together with seven employees of Taylors University, embarked on a wetland planting on July 22 at a new site, which aims to improve water quality that is flowing from the lake to the wetland area. A similar activity was conducted on July 24 with 33 students and lecturers from SEGI University.



## **World Rivers Day celebration**

GEC took on a prominent role at the national level World Rivers Day Celebration 2024 on Sept 20 at Sungai Tebrau, Johor organised by DID Malaysia. Through funding support from the National River Care Fund (NRCF), GEC organised a RIVER Ranger training for 50 students from Sultanah Engku Tun Aminah Secondary School (SETA) as well as for communities, including Friends of Sungai Tebrau. The participants learnt the theoretical and practical aspects of RIVER Ranger training and the school received a river monitoring kit.

On Sept 21, Friends of Sungai Tebrau community were presented with a RM5,000 grant from NRCF by Deputy Prime Minister, YAB Dato' Sri Haji Fadillah Haji Yusof, who is also the Minister of Energy Transition and Water Transformation. At the event, the DPM also launched the river address of Kampung Bakar Batu, Tebrau.

Additionally, our JKGEC member, Section 19 Resident Association clinched the third prize with a cash prize of RM10,000 for the country's coveted Anugerah Sumber Air Negara (AKSA) 2024, presented by the DPM. During the event, the DPM also visited GEC's exhibition booth.



Meanwhile in Perak on Sept 26, nearly 120 local community members and stakeholders were honoured at the Award and Recognition Ceremony 2024 for River Stewardship in Kinta River Basin. The event co-organised by GEC and the DID Perak, with support from Yayasan Hasanah (YH) was officiated by Perak State Exco for Infrastructure, Energy, Water, and Public Transport, YBhg. Dato' Seri Ir. Mohammad Nizar Jamaluddin.

In Kuala Lumpur, GEC also participated as an exhibitor at DID Federal Territory Kuala Lumpur's World Rivers Day celebrations on Sept 12. Amongst others, RCP showcased the RIVER Ranger and SMART Ranger modules, and a demonstration on making candles with used cooking oil.

## **Forest and Coastal Programme**

### **Ecosystem Restoration Initiatives**

- GEC planted a total of 12,916 trees with involvement of over 1,600 volunteers across Peninsular Malaysia during this quarter under FCP's partnership initiatives. These include 5,200 mangrove trees at Kuala Muda (Kedah), Kampung Dato' Hormat (Selangor), Kuala Gula (Perak), Pulau Tanjung Surat (Johor), and Parit Kassim in Muar (Johor). Peatland and inland trees (7,716) including high-quality enrichment species at Raja Musa Forest Reserve – RMFR and Kuala Langat North Forest Reserve – KLNFR (Selangor), Jus Dam (Malacca), and Gunung Arong Forest Reserve – GAFR (Johor).

### **Environmental Education Workshops and Programmes**

- Singapore-based charity, PM Haze organised a regional visit with 20 students and six academic staff, from Singapore, Indonesia and Malaysia. It included two-day visit (July 21-22) hosted by GEC to RMFR and KLNFR, the Temuan Culture Information Centre (TCIC) and GEC-CoSPeC to learn about community-based peatland restoration and water management through Nature-based Solutions (NbS).
- GEC hosted a 14-day Wetlands study tour of Malaysia (Aug 24 to Sept 7) for 20 RMIT (Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology) students accompanied by two lecturers, focusing on community-led wetlands restoration and ecosystem conservation in Selangor, providing hands-on learning in wetland conservation and management.



- Mangrove Forest Ranger Programme hosted a nine-day Mangrove Forests Education and Awareness Carnival in Kota Tinggi, Johor (Sept 1 to 11), engaging 2,619 students, teachers, parents, and staff from 12 schools in raising awareness about mangrove conservation.

### **Community-Based Initiatives**

- GEC's Community-Based Conservation of Peat Swamp Forest Biodiversity Project in Gunung Arong Forest Reserve (GAFR) engaged local communities in the area to document fish species, including two endangered Betta species (*B. tussyae* and *B. tomi*) from July to September 2024. This demonstrates the effectiveness of collaborative conservation and highlight's GAFR's ecological importance for future initiatives.

### **Conservation Efforts and Partnership**

- A two month-long aerial and field assessment was conducted from July to August 2024 at the North Selangor Peat Swamp Forest (NSPSF) and South Selangor Peat Swamp Forest (SSPSF) to collect and record data on peat soil and water parameters, biodiversity (flora and fauna), and hydrological dynamics. This provided a baseline for the development of Integrated Management Plan for both NSPSF and SSPSF, conservation efforts and future monitoring strategies.



- GEC and Leader Energy launched the 5-Year Mangrove Conservation and Climate Action for Sustainable Living Programme on July 6 at FC 10 in Merbok Forest Reserve, Kedah. This programme aims to protect and restore mangrove ecosystems, promote climate resilience, and sustainable living within local communities.
- GEC and Aramco signed an agreement on International Mangrove Conservation Day on July 26, 2024 to expand the Community-based Mangrove Protection and Planting Programme in Southeast Asia. The aim is to protect mangrove ecosystems, engage local communities, and promote sustainable livelihoods through impactful cross-border partnerships.
- A Forest Biodiversity Scientific Expedition at GAFR in Mersing, Johor, co-organised by Johor Forestry Department, GEC and TH Plantations, was conducted on Sept 17 to 21, focusing on research of peat swamp, freshwater swamp and mangrove forests. The expedition gathered biodiversity data, verified forest strata, and confirmed the presence of a quartz ridge in GAFR to support future conservation efforts.
- Yayasan Sime Darby and GEC launched a three-year project at Parit Kasim in Muar (Johor), on Sept 30, aimed at the restoration of 25 hectares of mangrove ecosystems through the planting of 50,000 trees across four states. This initiative supports six community organisations and encompasses post-planting maintenance and hydrology management, while also empowering local communities in Johor, Kedah, Perak, and Selangor.

## Peatland Programme



The Peninsular Malaysia Forestry Department (JPSM) appointed GEC to prepare Guidelines to Develop State Action Plan on Peatlands (SAPP) in July 2024, which is a tool to assist the state governments to prepare SAPPs for their respective states. It will contribute to the country's effort to implement relevant activities outlined in the ASEAN Peatland Management Strategy (APMS) and later the second National Action Plan on Peatlands (NAPP). Stakeholder meetings with JPSM and the Sustainable Management of Peatland Ecosystems in Malaysia (SMPEM) project management offices at national level and state (Pahang, Selangor, Sabah and

Sarawak) was held on July 12, with follow-up meetings were hosted in Sabah and Sarawak on Aug 27 and 28 to present the SAPP Guideline concept.

The International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) appointed GEC to support the Malaysian government in developing a project design document on Sustainable Agriculture and Plantation in Peatland Landscapes in Malaysia (SAPPLIM). A design mission (Sept 10 to 25) and stakeholder meetings and field visits at federal and state levels, were crucial to gather stakeholder feedback. Amidst ongoing discussion with relevant government agencies, the draft SAPPLIM project document is expected to be completed by end of 2024 for the government's review.

The five-year Technical Assistance and Knowledge Exchange (TAKE-SMPEM) project has officially ended on Sept 30, with activities implemented at national and state levels, involved Pahang, Sabah, Sarawak and Selangor, as well as support to Indonesia and Uganda, through collaboration with local CSO partners.

### **Pahang**

In Pahang, GEC trained Kg Meranti and Kg Wah Wah Villagers on nursery maintenance for the GEC's seedling buyback programme (July 2 and Sept 19). Through the session, the communities learnt to improve their seedling production and enhance nursery management skills, while gaining practical knowledge on collecting wildlings and sowing seeds to increase the variety of peatland species seedlings in the nursery. GEC also conducted a Fire Prevention Awareness Programme series in collaboration SMPEM and DOE, for several villages within the Southeast Pahang Peatland Landscape (SEPPL) namely Kg Sungai Kalong, Kg Cenderawasih, Kg Selingkong, Kg Arong, and Kg RPS Runchang. The series was aimed to educate communities on the consequences of open burning in peat areas and enhance their knowledge to help reduce peat fires in the landscape.



### **Sabah and Sarawak**

Following the March fires that ravaged almost 15 ha of farmland in Ladang Nenas Kg. Takuli, Beaufort, in Sabah, impacting the income of the farmers, two canal blocks were built in an effort to raise the water level in this area. On Sept 5, GEC contributed a total of 200 saplings, to five villages for the district level low carbon programme, as part of a CSR activity under the *I-Komuniti Lestari* programme together with the Kuala Penyu District Council.



In Sarawak, GEC initiated a rapid assessment to support development of a project proposal to establish additional conservation areas of community's watershed protection and a connectivity area linking the Pulong Tau National Park to the Heart of Borneo area.

### Regional

GEC organised a partner dialogue for the ASEAN Investment Framework for Haze-Free Sustainable Land Management (AIF-HFSLM) on Aug 12. This created a platform for potential collaboration with other projects from the United States Agency for International Development-Partnerships for Green Investment (USAID-PAGI) and Sustainable Rice Platform (SRP). The dialogue was held back-to-back with the Regional Programme Steering Committee of Measurable Action for Haze-Free Sustainable Land Management in Southeast Asia (MAHFSA) and ASEAN Task Force on Peatlands (ATFP), which discussed establishment of an ad-hoc task force and implementation plan for the AIF.



### Yayasan Gambut

Yayasan Gambut embarked on a carbon assessment programme of an estimated 300 hectares of peat forest area in collaboration with a professional team from Yogyakarta. The team initiated the project by undertaking a carbon assessment survey in August and is currently compiling information for analysis to the initial report.



A mangrove monitoring training program was conducted from August 9-11 in Kelapa Pati Village. Subsequently, a baseline report of the mangrove assessment was completed in Kelapa Pati and Buruk Bakul Villages. A total of 7,766 mangrove seedlings were planted in Buruk Bakul Village, and 4,000 mangrove seedlings were propagated in Kelapa Pati Village.

## Outreach & Partnership Programme

### JKGEC's webpage on GEC website

At the start of Q3 2024, GEC successfully completed the revamp of the GEC website. The new website is now updated, fresh layout and design, making it breezier to browse both on desktop and mobile devices, and offers a better UX (user experience) for visitors to the website. A new feature in the website is the introduction of a new webpage for the recently founded GEC Community Network (Jaringan Komuniti GEC - JKGEC). The platform that enables their designated community leaders to share pictorial updates of their key activities with GEC to showcase and highlight to the public.



### ***GEC's second nationwide Community Sharing & Learning Forum***

From August 17-19, GEC hosted its second nationwide Community Peer Learning Forum and Site Visit with participation of JKGECC communities. The 3-day, 2-night forum in Ipoh, Perak was attended by 50 indigenous peoples and local community members (IPLCs) from 32 JKGECC communities nationwide (including Sabah and Sarawak) and Indonesia, who are actively undertaking conservation and restoration activities alongside GEC. The forum served as a platform for communities to exchange experience and knowledge, focusing on sustainable management of river and water sources, and included animated discourse among the community members. A site visit to three community-based project sites Klebang Selatan, Chemor Idaman, and Kampung Sungai Tonggang, was an opportune peer learning experience for them.



### ***Media Familiarisation Trip***

The forum included a Media Familiarisation Trip that provided a unique opportunity for journalists and media representatives to explore community-led sustainable initiatives across several key locations. Through the exhibition showcasing the locally-produced sustainable products by the various communities, the media representatives had the opportunity to interview community leaders and members, learning firsthand about their sustainable production methods and the impact of these initiatives on local livelihoods. A total of four media agencies followed the trip, namely Bernama, New Straits Times, The Edge and Sin Chew Daily. The media representatives joined participants along all activities and experienced first-hand on the sustainable efforts implemented by the local communities, supported by GEC together with various government agencies and corporate partners.

The media familiarisation trip successfully highlighted the diverse sustainable practices and products developed by these communities, fostering greater awareness and appreciation of their efforts towards sustainability and community empowerment.

### ***GEC is co-beneficiary of Boat Noodle's fundraising campaign***

GEC was selected to be one of two beneficiaries for a fundraising campaign launched by restaurant chain, Boat Noodle in August. The restaurateur committed to donate RM1 to both GEC and co-beneficiary Upcycled by Fuze Ecoteer for every cup of Cha Yen drink sold at any of its Boat Noodle outlets starting August 16. Through the ongoing campaign they aim to sell 100,000 cups to raise RM50,000 for each organisation.



# Visibility

There were 51 media coverages on GEC between July and September 2024 (RCP: 27; FCP: 15; General: 9). These coverages had a total PR value of more than RM 1,194,357 and cumulative potential reach of more than 3,637,542 people.

## Volunteers plant 1,000 mangrove trees in Merbok Forest Reserve



A THOUSAND mangrove trees have been planted by volunteers in Merbok Forest Reserve, Kedah, as part of a programme to commemorate International Day for the Conservation of the Mangroves Ecotopes, which falls on July 26.

The Greater mangrove conservation and climate action for sustainable living programme was launched by power producer Lender Energy in collaboration with Global Environment Centre (GEC), Kedah Forestry Department and Sungai Mudi River Basin Management (PMSM).

The planting of thousands of saplings (shakar mangrove) marked the beginning of the programme, which aims to restore and sustainably manage 10ha of degraded mangrove area in the Merbok Forest Reserve and Sungai Mudi River Basin, through the planting of 1,000 mangrove trees.

The effort also signals Kedah's commitment to preserving its mangrove ecosystems by fostering a harmonious coexistence between local communities and mangrove forests.

Through a collaborative effort involving private sector, local authorities, environmental organisations and stakeholders, the project will raise awareness about the irreplaceable role mangroves play in mitigating the effects of climate change.

By empowering communities with knowledge and practical solutions, the project aims to transform them into active stewards of these irreplaceable ecosystems, safeguarding them for generations to come.

The programme was launched by Kedah Forestry Department director Mohamad Abdullah. Commenting on the initiative, Mohamad said, "Mangroves are the backbone of our coastal communities, providing invaluable protection and sustaining local livelihoods."

"By aligning this initiative with the national 100 Million Tree Planting Campaign and the National Mangrove Restoration Programme, we are demonstrating our unwavering commitment to restoring and protecting these critical ecosystems."

Lender Energy group chief executive officer Gan Isee, Huan said, "This transformative initiative, supported by a RM1.5m grant and volunteer efforts of our staff, is a testament to the company's unwavering commitment to sustainability, environmental stewardship and our core goals."

"By working hand-in-hand with stakeholders, we aim to restore the mangroves, enhance carbon sequestration and contribute to a more resilient and sustainable future for all."

GEC director Faisal Pahal emphasised the project's holistic approach.

"The objective is not merely to rehabilitate the mangroves, but to empower the local community to become the guardians of this ecosystem."

"By building their capacity and fostering a deep sense of ownership, we aim to ensure the long-term sustainability of our conservation efforts."

"This initiative aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, contributing to the global movement to restore and protect critical ecosystems," said Faisal.

## Protecting water sources by managing kitchen waste

### MBRJ partners with others to educate F&B players on proper disposal of fats, oil and grease

RETAILERS from the Greater (MBRJ) partnered with The Water Project to promote water sustainability in the city's F&B industry.

An initiative aimed at reducing water consumption and promoting sustainable practices was launched by the Greater (MBRJ) in collaboration with The Water Project, a UK-based environmental charity.

The programme attracted 20 F&B businesses, including restaurants, cafes and food outlets.

The initiative was supported by a grant from the Greater (MBRJ) and the Water Project.

Greater (MBRJ) has been supporting various corporate social responsibility projects since 2017, with GEC, which was set up in 2018, working to drive social and environmental impact.

The programme aims to reduce water consumption and improve water efficiency in the F&B sector.

Participants were educated on the importance of water conservation and the impact of kitchen waste on water resources.

The programme also included a workshop on how to manage kitchen waste properly, including the use of grease traps and recycling bins.

The initiative is part of a larger effort to promote water sustainability in the city's F&B industry.
